Today, we would like to introduce three idioms that are related to "clothes" to you again.



It's – 'at the drop of a hat'.

you are willing to do it immediately without a second thought.




Example sentence: If you need help, just call on me. I can come at the drop of a hat.



Let's take a look at the second idiom.



It is - to 'fill someone's shoe'.



It means to assume someone's position or duties.



Example sentence: 'It will be very difficult to fill Anne's shoe when she retires'.



Repeat: 'It will be very difficult to fill Anne's shoe when she retires'.

Let's take a look at the last idiom.

If you need to tighten your belt you must spend your money carefully because there is less available.

It is – 'tighten one's belt'.

Repeat: I need to tighten my belt as I have lost my job.
