Fast fashion can be defined as cheap, trendy clothing produced



and sold in high street stores and online. They are used quickly



and then put into the rubbish bin.



Fast fashion is produced in sweatshops to supply developed



countries with cheap, trendy clothes at the expense of



workers in developing countries. Countries such as Malaysia,



where delivery workers work on 'no work, no pay' contracts with



base salaries that are barely above the minimum wage.



They rely on bonuses to get a living wage, but they can only



earn this by delivering products on some of Asia's most dangerous roads.



Many workers are exploited in the textile industry. They receive



low wages and no compensation if their factory closes down.



For example, Indonesian workers travelled to Tokyo and campaigned



outside Uniqlo stores to show the company how they had been



affected after their factory shut down in 2015. Over 2,000 workers



were left unemployed with no compensation.



Also, women are unable to get treatment when they get sick



because of the scandalous wage, they cannot afford to send their



children to school all the while enduring long hours, unsafe



conditions and almost no pay. I think that large retail brands



should increase the minimum wage because it can make the



workers become more engaged. Also, I think they can reduce the



working hours to allow workers enough time to rest, socialize



and care for their families. Further, they should have holidays



on a regular basis. Consequently, they will feel happy and rested and



complete their work more efficiently.
